Summer Opportunities

- **Claffin University's PRISIM Program** (9th-12th grade) Criteria: must have completed Algebra I and one year of high school science (in grade 9), must have an aptitude for science and math, must meet federal income guidelines and /or be a potential first- generation college student and must be a resident of SC. This is a six week residential program (from June 13th through July 24th) which includes an intensified summer curriculum that increases the students' knowledge base in science, mathematics, engineering and technology. All students will receive a weekly stipend. The program will provide room and board and round trip transportation. ****Columbia College Scholars** (juniors) Criteria: top 25% of junior class, minimum of 1020 on Sat or 22 ACT. Scholars may be eligible for Founders, Presidential or Trustees Scholarships. Self-nomination forms are available in Guidance. **Deadline: March 11th**

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Scholarship (female seniors)

Student must enroll in an accredited post secondary school within 12 months of receiving the scholarship, have a minimum GPA of 2.5, submit an autobiographical statement, a FAFSA application, an official transcript, a photo, and two recommendations (one from a school official). The Hispanic-American Association Scholarship Award Competition

(seniors) Student must be a 2010 graduate, of Hispanic descent (only Spanish speaking countries, first or second generation), must be accepted for full time classes, at an accredited college of tech school, live legally in the USA, have a GPA of 3.5+ and have a family income no greater than \$60,000. ****Howard W. ****Newberry College Scholar** (juniors) Minimum requirements: 3.0 GPA, 1100 SAT or 24 ACT and top 30% of class. **Deadline: March 15th**

2010 Nina Neely Scholarship Essay Contest (seniors) Scholarships for first, second and third place will be awarded. SC Coaches Association of Women's Sports Educator's Scholarship (SCCAWS) (female seniors) The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage student athletes to enter the field of education. Requirements include: Academic excellence, recommendations from guidance counselor and two teachers, extra-curricular activities involving athletic and non-athletic participation (must be an eligible high school participant on one or more athletic teams), enrolling female college freshman who plans to major in education, a one page essay (topic specific), minimum SAT 1000, ACT 22, rank in class and GPA. Self-nomination forms available in Guidance. **Deadline to Guidance March 8th**

SC Coaches Association of Women's Sports and Trophies by "M" Medical Scholarship (SCCAWS and Trophies by "M") (female seniors) The purpose of the SCCAWS and Trophies by "M" Scholarship is to encourage student athletes to enter the field of medicine. Requirements include: Academic excellence, recommendations from guidance counselor and two teachers, extra-curricular activities involving athletic and non-athletic participation (must be an eligible high school participant on one or more athletic teams), enrolling female college freshman who plans to major in education, a one page essay (topic specific), minimum SAT 1000, ACT 22, rank in class, GPA, financial need (income tax forms required), include a list of all colleges and universities to which the applicant has been accepted. Self-nomination forms available in Guidance. **Deadline to Guidance March 8th**

South Carolina Association of Extension Administrative Professionals SCAEAP (seniors) Each year SCAEAP awards a \$500 scholarship to one SC student to study secretarial science, computer science or business management. Applications are available in Guidance. **Deadline: March 31st**

****SC State Fair Scholarships** (seniors) Must be a full time resident of SC and plan to attend a SC college, university or technical college. Essay required. Applications are available in Guidance. **Applications must be postmarked by March 19th**

Southeastern States Pupil Transportation Conference Scholarship (SESPTC) (seniors) two \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to SC HS students. Applicants must have a gross taxable income of less than \$75,000 for each of the past five school years and applicant's parent or guardian must have been actively employed in school transportation for the past five years. Applications are available in Guidance. **Deadline: April 30th**

Spartanburg Community College Scholarships (seniors) Students who have applied to Spartanburg Community College may be eligible for a variety of scholarships. A list of the scholarships and eligibility criteria are attached to the application. Applications are available in guidance. **Deadline: July 1st**

Spartanburg County Livestock Producers' Association Scholarship (seniors) A four-year scholarship will be awarded to a student who resides in Spartanburg county and has been accepted to Clemson University with a major in one of the fields offered by the College of Agriculture, Forestry, and Life Sciences. The following will be considered when choosing the applicant: Academic achievement, SAT scores, leadership, morals, attitude, ambition, references and other financial assistance available. The Tryon Riding and Hunt Club (TR&HC) Education Scholarship (seniors) TR&HC offers scholarships to equestrian-oriented students who seek further development through additional education programs. Criteria: must be a member of a local/national equine organization, demonstrate financial need, must complete an application, financial need statement, and applicants cannot be related to any TR&HC Board of Director, member, officer or employee. ****Wofford Scholars Program** (juniors) Criteria: top 10% of class, minimum 1250 PSAT or SAT, or 28 ACT, must demonstrate qualities of scholarship, leadership, and potential success. Self-Nomination forms available in Guidance. Nominees will be screened by the Wofford Scholars Selection Committee. **Deadline to Guidance: March 24th**
